# Overview of OCFC Request

- In 2018, OCFC approached jurisdictions with proposal for shared funding agreement
- MOU, Coordinator Job Description and Work Plan developed with input from each jurisdiction
- MOU modeled after Orange County Partnership to End Homelessness agreement
- Proposed MOU covers 2-year period with option for renewal



## Fiscal Considerations

- OCFC proposes a population-based funding formula:
  - Chapel Hill 41% - \$29,110
  - Orange County 39% - \$27,690
  - Carrboro 15% - \$10,650
  - Hillsborough 5% - \$3,550
- Total annual proposed budget: \$71,000
- On June 2018, Council approved up to \$25,000 in CDBG Program Plan for this purpose
- Estimated 4 months of funding needed for Town's portion in FY19 - \$9,000
