The applicant team presented information about the project, including elements related to the Board's sustainability review criteria. The Board made comments and asked clarifying questions related to: ADA compliance, exterior lighting, lighting and water fixture efficiency, bicycle parking, and impervious surface area.

The applicant team presented information about the project, including elements related to the Board's sustainability review criteria. The Board made comments and asked clarifying questions related to: all-electric design, heat pumps, unit size, canopy coverage, previous land use, trail substrate, soil condition for vegetable gardens, use of recycled materials, and the mobility shelter.

Public Comment: Robert Beasley commended EmPOWERment for an attractive, forward-thinking and meaningful project.

A motion was made by Member Sinclair, seconded by Member Henkel, to recommend that the Council approve the conditional zoning district for the PEACH Apartments development application located at 107 Johnson Street with the mobility shelter located in the setback, including the following note

and special considerations. Ella Feathers concurred with the motion.

Note: The ESAB appreciates the applicant's environmental considerations that have been put into this project and for their commitment to affordable housing.

Special Considerations:

- More pervious parking spaces
- Highly efficient air-to-water heat pumps for heating and cooling system
- Induction range tops for cooking
- Rooftop solar to reduce monthly operating cost from all-electric design
- Locally sourced and/or recycled materials
