

Additional perspective from Planning staff:

<u>Council Question</u>: What impact would closing the proposed road from Smith Avenue to Coolidge Street have on the Coolidge Street property owner's ability to develop his landlocked parcel?

<u>Planning Staff Response</u>: The original request from Judge Baddour at 416 Smith Street requests consideration for closing the entire unopened right-of-way. However, closure of the entire unopened right-of-way could potentially restrict the development potential of 530 Coolidge Street, which would become landlocked without access to a public right-of-way. As a result, we recommend closing only the northern portion of the unopened right-of-way, and have reflected this in the Council memo.
