COA SUMMARY

The applicant, David Swanson on behalf of UNC Chapel Hill, requests a COA for:

- New steel fencing in a traditional black finish, measuring 4-feet in height, joined to existing fencing and providing a continuous, secure perimeter enclosure around the site.
- New decorative steel gates in a traditional black finish, including a pedestrian gate at the main entrance walkway as well as a vehicular gate at the new driveway turnaround.
- New 11-foot-wide vehicular turnaround area adjacent to the existing driveway

EXISTING CONDITIONS

The proposed location is zoned Office/Institutional-4 (OI-4) and is in the Franklin-Rosemary Historic District.
