**A RESOLUTION APPROVING FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 FUNDING FOR THE HUMAN SERVICES FUNDING PROGRAM (2025-06-25/R-6)**

WHEREAS, in 1981 the Council established the Human Services Program to enter into performance agreements with agencies that provide services that address the community's human service's needs; and

WHEREAS, since its inception the Town's Human Services Program has supported a range of vital programs and services of our nonprofit partners that address vital needs within the Chapel Hill community; and

WHEREAS, the Town acknowledges the critical role that our nonprofit partners play in addressing key community needs and the importance of continued investment at a local level as needs are increasing and resources available from other sources are being reduced.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Chapel Hill that the Council hereby approves the following allocations for performance agreements with human service agencies in FY 2025-26 to continue to address many of the community's human service needs identified by Town staff:
