Recommendation: That the Council adopt RESOLUTION (2019-01-30/R-5) which:




- Postpones consideration of the land use for the ETJ Study Area north of I-40; and,
- Authorizes the Town Manager to:
 - continue efforts to work with governmental partners prior to planning
 & executing a visioning effort for the area south of Southern Village;
 - include the cost of such an effort in the budget proposals for FY2020;
 and,
 - continue to pursue the refinement of the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) with the possibility of amending the FLUM



Background

- Community members requested that refinement efforts include additional areas:
 - From the Southern Village Park and Ride, on South 15-501, to the border with Chatham County
 - The Extraterritorial Jurisdictional (ETJ) area north of I-40



- core or common values
- a shared vision for the future

1. Determine if governmental partners wish to amend the WASMPBA




- 2. If so, then work with partners to:
 - Agree on the new location of the Urban Services Boundary
 - Perform preliminary engineering studies to support that new location
 - Memorialize amendment to WASMPBA in an acceptable form

- Engineering costs


