I am a strong advocate for strategic capacity building, community engagement and power redistribution. The perspective that I bring to all of my work is deeply rooted in equity and racial justice. As such, I recognize the importance of creating pathways for everyday people, and particularly those with marginalized identities to be engaged in decision-making. I am currently pursuing a dual Masters degree in Public Health and City and Regional Planning from UNC Chapel Hill and bring those perspectives to my work as well. I also hold a Bachelors degree from Penn State where I studied Health Policy and Administration, so I also bring a policy lens to my work. I operate from a framework that centers the health and prosperity of those oftentimes silenced and left in the margins.

As a current Co-President of the Minority Student Caucus here at the Gillings School of Public Health here at UNC Chapel Hill, I serve as a liaison between Gillings leadership and students of color and actively work to promote anti-racism in our school. Some particular areas that I have advocated for on behalf of students of color include racial equity training for faculty and staff, de-centering whiteness in public health training, research and practice, and decolonizing classrooms and curricula through presentations at the Dean's Council and meetings with several school leaders. Additionally, I manage a team of 9 other student leaders to promote systems change, professional development, community service and community building through various programs and initiatives including the Minority Health Conference. As an MPH student here at Gillings, I have been trained in quantitative and qualitative research methods. Moreover, through my academic and professional experiences, I have been trained to effectively identify and summarize existing research for literature reviews on a variety of subject areas, including community-based participatory research, public housing and photo-voice methodology, to inform research publications. I have also authored and co-authored several written products on topics related to the implications of structural racism on the Black community (many of these topics focused on racism in housing policies and practices and the impact on health outcomes). Through my professional experiences with the Society of Public Health Education and AcademyHealth, I have synthesized existing research to inform policy and advocacy strategy. I am also versed in providing research support for publications and producing written content based on existing and original research. Furthermore, I am well versed in supporting the logistic planning, marketing and communications and implementation of conferences and workshop training. In summary, to this position I bring my education and work experience paired with communication, advocacy, decision-making, management, writing and analytic skills.

ETHICS GUIDELINES FOR TOWN ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Members of advisory boards and commissions shall not discuss, advocate, or vote on any matter in which they have a conflict of interest or an interest which reasonably might appear to be in conflict with the concept of fairness in dealing with public business. A conflict of interest or a potential conflict occurs if a member has a separate, private, or monetary interest, either direct or indirect, in any issue or transaction under consideration. In addition, members of the Historic District Commission and Board of Adjustment, when these boards are hearing cases, serve as quasi-judicial bodies. Pursuant to State Statute 106A-388(e)(2), members of these boards “shall not participate in or vote on any quasi-judicial matter in a manner that would violate affected persons’ constitutional rights to an impartial decision maker. Impermissible violations of due process include, but are not limited to, a member having a fixed opinion prior to hearing the matter that is not susceptible to change, undisclosed ex parte communications, a close familial, business, or other associational relationship with an affected person, or a financial interest in the outcome of the matter.”

Any member who violates these Ethics Guidelines may be subject to removal from the board or commission. If the advisory board or commission member believes he/she has a conflict of interest then that member should ask the advisory board or commission to be recused from voting. The advisory board or commission should then vote on the question on whether or not to excuse the member making the request. In cases where the individual member or the advisory board or commission establishes a conflict of interest, then the advisory board or commission member shall remove themselves from the voting area. Any advisory board or commission member may seek the counsel of the Town Attorney on questions regarding the interpretation of these ethics guidelines or other conflict of interest matters. The interpretation may include a recommendation on whether or not the advisory board or commission member should excuse himself/herself from voting. The advisory board or commission member may request the Town Attorney respond in writing.

I bring the perspective of a concerned citizen (and scientist) that is trying to alter my own individual actions to reduce my personal footprint on the climate. I have been an avid user of public transit since I moved to Chapel Hill in about 2004, riding the TTA bus to work from my house off of Highway 54. I currently work in downtown Chapel Hill and often bike or take the bus around town. I drive an electric car and compost all of my organic waste with Compost Now. I think education and reaching out to friends and neighbors is something that can make an impact. For example, my neighborhood of Ironwoods had a community party recently. I asked our HOA board whether or not they would support composting all of the organic waste from this event. Composting is a way to have an immediate impact on reducing methane production, which is a more potent greenhouse gas than carbon dioxide. Everyone was very supportive. Prior to the party, I met with representatives from Orange County and borrowed containers to gather our waste (e.g., compostable plates, napkins, and food waste). I also borrowed utensils from the counties "Fork it Over" program. The effort was a huge success. Though this was a small amount of waste, several neighbors indicated they would try something similar for events they were helping to organize. I take these issues seriously and am willing to put in the effort to make an impact. I applaud Orange County and Town of Chapel Hill for forming this committee and I would be honored to serve as the town's representative.

Please provide a brief summary of any other relevant qualifications (skills, abilities, interests and/or experience) you bring.

I am a chemist and environmental engineer. I have a bachelors degree in Chemistry. I have a masters degree in Environmental Systems Engineering from Clemson University. I worked at RTI International from 1999 to 2005, as a consultant for the U.S. EPA. I earned a doctoral degree from the UNC School of Public Health in 2011 in Environmental Science and Engineering. After my Ph.D. program, I had a post-doctoral positional at EPA conducting energy system modeling of the biofuels industry. Energy System Modeling is a way to examine the flow of energy from production to utilization. The models I used at EPA take into account not only the use of energy but the emissions that are produced as a consequence. Thus, these models allow users to apply constraints, such as goals for minimizing our emissions, using the least cost options. During my time at EPA, I examined data from the U.S. Energy Information Administration to better understand energy usage patterns (EIA, <https://www.eia.gov>). I believe the goals we set as a committee should target projects that have the biggest reduction in greenhouse gases for the least cost. Tools such as energy system modeling may be more ambitious than what we need to do at a local level, but understanding the quantitative impact of actions we can start to do now, is an important component of prioritizing goals that we set. In addition to my research on the energy system, I also have a strong background in data analysis and visualization. Currently, I run a scientific software start-up in downtown Chapel Hill, Visual Data Tools. My quantitative skills could be an asset to this effort.
