Proclamation

WHEAREAS, plants and wildlife provide incalculable services for humankind, including health, cultural, economic, recreational, and spiritual benefits, among others; and

WHEREAS, in the United States and around the world, more than 2,300 species are recognized as at risk of extinction now or in the foreseeable future, and many more are experiencing declines in populations and future viability; and

WHEREAS, the planet is experiencing a biodiversity crisis, which many scientists conclude is the sixth mass extinction event, with plant and wildlife species across the globe facing heightened risk of extinction that is largely driven by human activity; and

WHEREAS, the United States has prioritized the conservation and recovery of imperiled species by enacting the Endangered Species Act of 1973 and other landmark conservation statutes; amd

WHEREAS, conservation and protection efforts implemented under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 have successfully prevented the extinction of more than 99 percent of species designated as threatened or endangered; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina is home to hundreds of endangered and threatened species, all of which deserve to thrive in their native habitats; and

WHEREAS, the protection and recovery of species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 is a remarkable success that should be celebrated.

NOW, THEREFORE, we the Mayor and Town Council of Chapel Hill do hereby proclaim May 16th, 2025 as

Endangered Species Day

in Chapel Hill and encourage everyone to work towards the conservation of endangered and threatened species everywhere and, also, to reach out to our US Senators and Representative to express support and appreciation for the federal tools provided for conservation which we will do as well.
