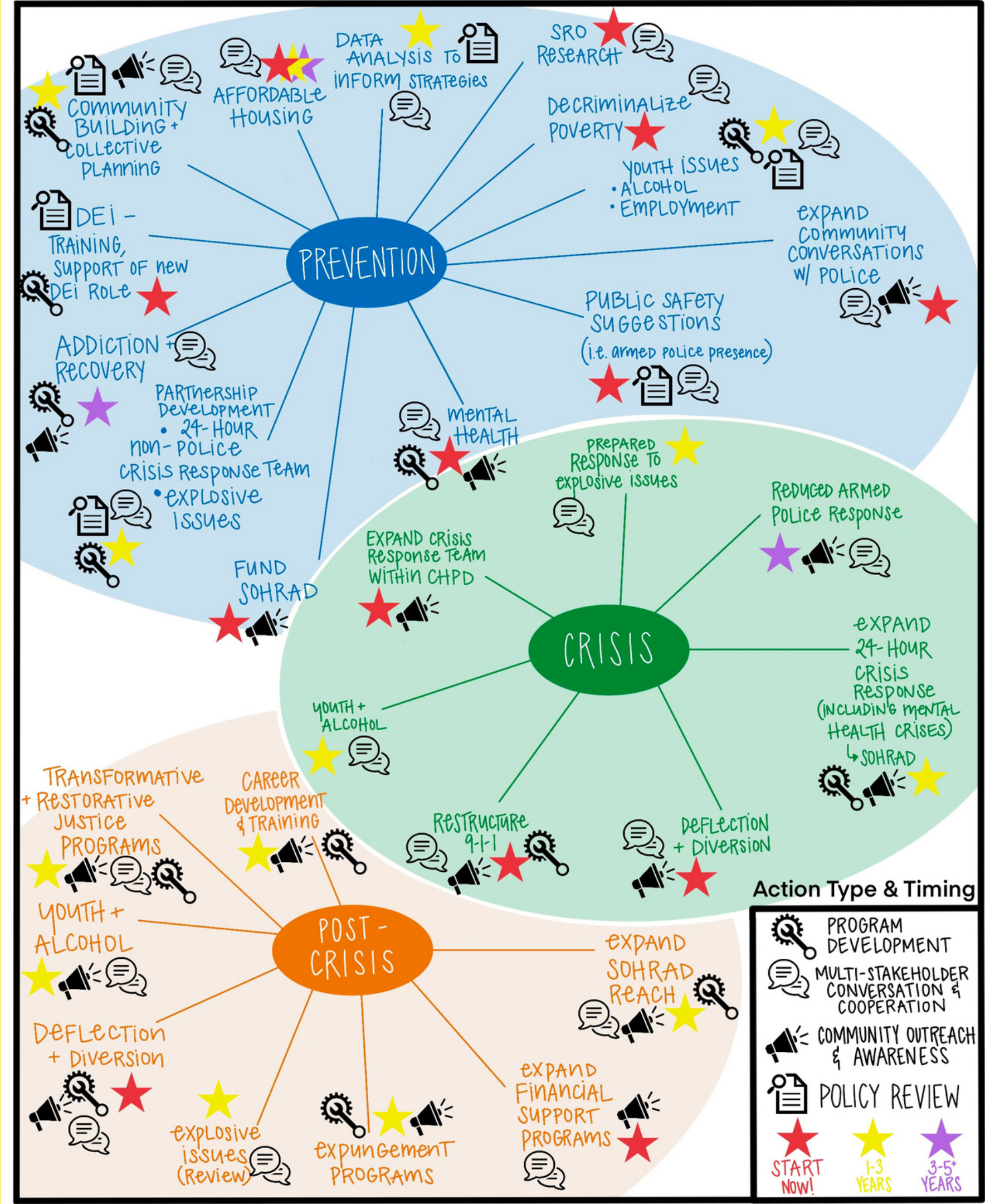
16 meetings over 9 months, plus Steering Committee meetings

Proposed Next Steps
