Safer at Home Phase 2 Summary (effective 5/22/20)



Face coverings and physical distancing encouraged

Yard Waste	<i>Modified weekly collection will resume June 4. Place in yard waste carts, rigid containers, or paper yard waste bags (no plastic bags).</i>
Restaurants	<i>Dine-in with restricted capacity; no more than 6 people per table unless members of same household</i>
Gatherings	<i>10 person limit indoors; 25 person limit for outdoor gatherings with physical distancing</i>
Parks and Trails	<i>Stay 6 feet from others</i>
Worship Services	<i>No restrictions</i>
Personal care	<i>Now open with capacity restrictions (includes personal grooming, tattoo shops, and massage centers)</i>

What's Still Closed

Gyms • Playgrounds • Theaters • Music Venues
Bowling Alleys • Museums

Town offices, Chapel Hill Public Library, and Parks & Rec buildings and indoor facilities are closed.

CARES Act Funding Plan

- **Town will receive approximately \$746,000**
- **CARES funding covers eligible expenses between March 1 and December 30, 2020.**
 - Expenses must meet CARES guidelines
 - First report is June 1, 2020
 - Final report is January 1, 2021
 - Plan may be adjusted before final report
- **Excess costs will be filed under FEMA and others**

CARES Act Funding Plan

Department Supplies	\$324,191
Computer & Peripherals	\$432,950
Contractual Services	\$312,000
Equipment	\$168,300
Affordable Housing Rent Assistance	\$50,000
Economic Support and Recovery	\$180,000
Total Projected Needs	\$1,967,441
CARES Allocation to Chapel Hill	\$746,410
