Hi Everyone,

Thank you for publicly recommending the use of masks and for providing masks to low-income Chapel Hill residents. However, we will not have

sufficient mask usage in Chapel Hill unless the town joins Durham and other municipalities/states in requiring masks in all stores, offices, and shared spaces of apartment buildings.

The evidence is overwhelming that this policy will save lives. Chapel Hill should give residents 3-4 days to obtain a mask, bandana, or home-made cloth face covering (even if it's an old T-Shirt!) and then begin enforcing the requirement. Building staff - not police - should enforce the mask requirement. It's great that Chapel Hill is providing masks to low-income residents -- I support this and think our town should scale up this effort!

Every day we go without a mask requirement is another day when our family and friends are put at unnecessary risk.
