Update on 828 MLK Property

Council Business Meeting June 11, 2025

Since we last spoke to you about the 828 site...

- We resampled the soil and water at the site.
- We signed the Brownfields agreement.
- We developed and deployed a community engagement initiative.
- We have developed an initial vision for future uses of the site

February 2025 Soil & Water Sampling

- As compared to previous samples, groundwater concentrations of metals are similar in buried materials and higher in the underlying aquifer on the site.
- There's no indication contaminants are impacting Bolin Creek above typical background levels or federal and state screening criteria.
- In one of ten soils samples just outside the fence, there's a higher concentration of one metal above background and screening criteria. Risk remains within acceptable levels and remediation activities began on May 22nd.






- Consult with experts

Possible Future Use(s)

Based on a variety of inputs, here's an initial vision for the site...

- Bus Rapid Transit Station along MLK Blvd (planned)
- Allowable recreation courts (e.g., basketball, tennis, pickleball)
- Parking
- Municipal Services Center

This would require us to remove coal ash to build a retaining wall and cap and cover the rest of the site.
