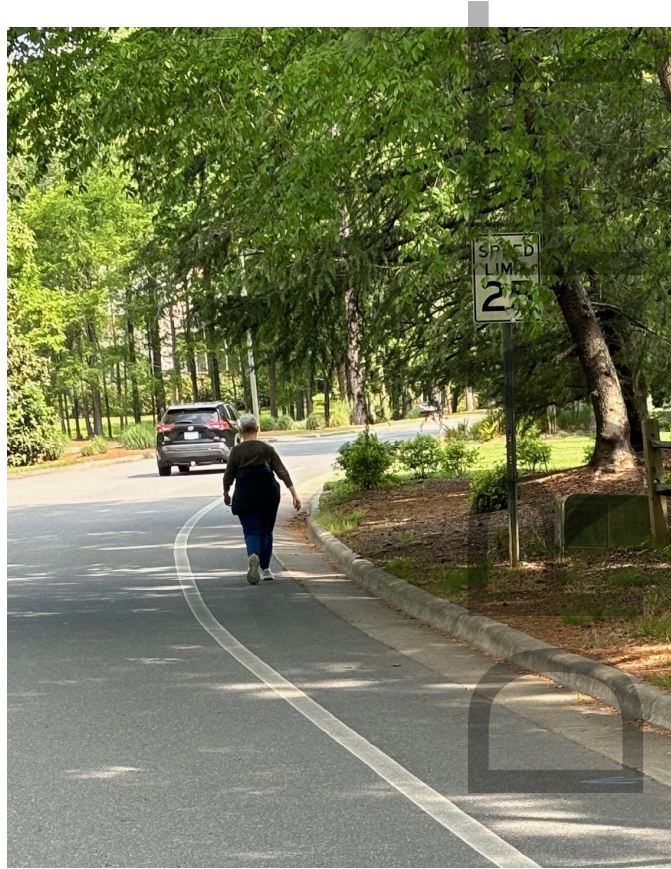

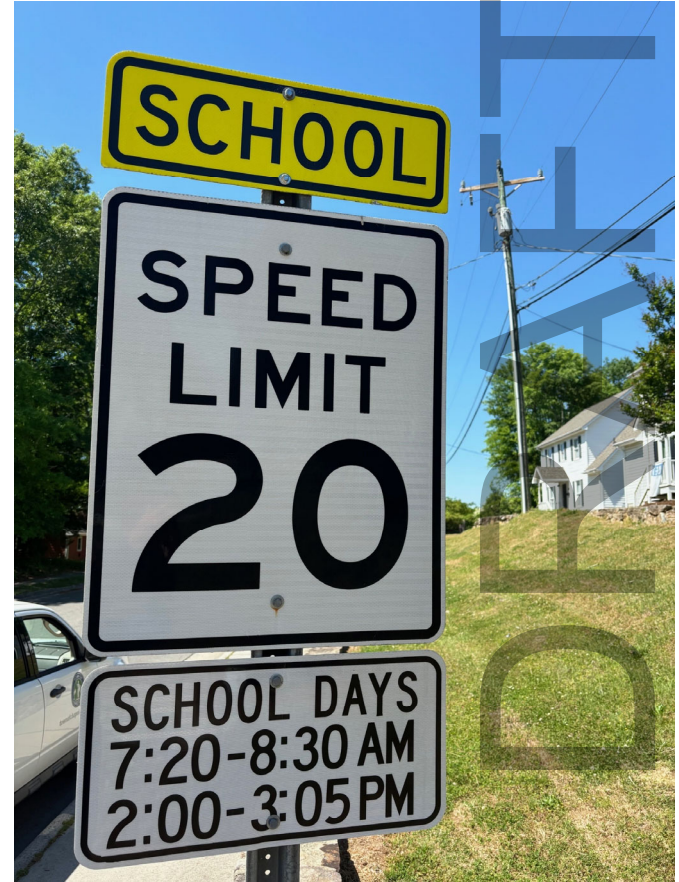

Old Policy vs. New Policy

- Complaint-driven
- Reactive
- Onus on resident
- Prioritized based on data
- No clear thresholds
- Speed humps/tables

- Data-driven
- Proactive (and reactive)
- Less resident responsibility
- Reviewed based on data
- Thresholds for further review
- Traffic circles, chicanes, bump outs

TO QUALIFY FOR TRAFFIC CALMING, THE FOLLOWING
MUST BE TRUE



AT LEAST 500 CARS CAUSE
THE PROBLEM



NO MORE THAN 6,000 CARS
CAUSE THE PROBLEM



AT LEAST 15% OF CARS GO
6+ MPH OVER SPEED LIMIT
