STREET NAME CHANGE PETITION TO THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

(A)

We, the property owners who have signed the attached petitions, being owners of real property abutting and addressed off of Dixie Drive and Dixie Lane, hereby Petition the Town of Chapel Hill to request the street name of Dixie Drive located between Stateside and Collums/Indian Trail in North Forest Hills to be changed to the continuation of Seminole Drive, and the name of Dixie Lane to be changed to another name.

We understand that each property owner will be responsible for any costs associated with changes in driver's license information, registrations, personal or business checks, or other personal documents related to a street name or address change.

We understand that there will be no need for a change in home or mailbox numbers as this street name change will allow us to keep our current home and mailbox numbers.

(B)

In support of this Street Name Change Petition, we show as follows:

Dixie Drive in North Chapel Hill runs approximately a mile and a half from Stateside to the four way intersection of Dixie Drive/Seminole Drive and Collums Road/Indian Trail Road. Seminole Road continues from that intersection for approximately one mile. Dixie Lane runs one block from Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. to Dixie Drive

The reason for this request is that the name "Dixie" has connotations of slavery, the exploitation of black people, and racism, that we would like to avoid.

The most accepted origin of the name "Dixie" is the Mason-Dixon line between Maryland and Pennsylvania drawn in 1767. It was regarded as the dividing line between slave states south of it and free states north of it. "Dixie" and "Dixieland" became nicknames for the slaveholding states south of the Mason-Dixon Line. During the Congressional debates regarding the Missouri Compromise, Congress discussed the Mason-Dixon Line as the boundary between slave states and free states.

By the mid-nineteenth century just before the Civil War "Dixie" was the name of a minstrel song composed and performed in blackface by Daniel Decatur Emmett in 1859. His performances, with his hands and face painted black, were billed as a "plantation song and dance." By that point in popular culture "Dixie" was associated with the South and recognized as a racist term.

The song became the Confederate Army's most popular marching song and the unofficial national anthem of the Confederacy.

Jesse Helms greeted either Barbara Jordan, the first Southern African-American woman elected to the U.S. House of Representative, or Carol Mosely Braun, the first African American in the U.S. Senate, by whistling Dixie to her. There has been some movement to remove the name Dixie. In 2015, Riviera Beach in Florida changed the name of Old Dixie Highway to President Barack Obama Highway. In February of last year, Miami-Dade County voted to change the name of the Dixie Highway in that County to the Harriet Tubman Highway. (The Dixie Highway runs through nine other states.) The Dixie Chicks changed their name to the Chicks. Dolly Parton dropped the "Dixie" from the name of her Civil War-themed park formerly the "Dixie Stampede."

(C)

Ironically, in Chapel Hill, Dixie Drive runs parallel to Martin Luther King Blvd. and the one block access road to Martin Luther King Blvd. from Dixie Drive is called Dixie Lane.

There are approximately 24 houses abutting and addressed off of Dixie Drive. The property owners of 15 of those houses submit this Petition.

There are two houses abutting and addressed of Dixie Lane. The property owner of one of those houses joins this Petition.

Several houses abutting on Dixie Drive are on the corner of another street and the property owners have chosen an address on the other street in order to avoid the Dixie Drive address — which strikes us as a vote in favor of the name change. For example the two houses on the corner of Dixie Drive and Stateside both use addresses on Stateside. One of those is owned by a former member of the Town Council. Two houses facing Dixie Drive on the corner of Dixie Drive and Barbara Court use addresses on Barbara Court. The Christian Science Church which is on the corner of Dixie Drive and Dixie Lane — but whose

property appears to run to Martin Luther King Blvd. — uses an address on Martin Luther King Blvd.

The property owners of three houses abutting and addressed on Dixie Drive oppose this Petition. The property owners of two other houses abutting and addressed on Dixie Drive have voted that they are neutral on the petition. The property owners of the other houses abutting and addressed on Dixie Drive, including one who is not living here but has tenants who support the Petition and who has been contacted three times by email, have not responded in any way to the Petition question. The property owner of one of the two houses on Dixie Lane supports this Petition. The other does not.

The pandemic restrictions have made some of these communications somewhat difficult.

(D)

Our preference for a new name for Dixie Drive is simply to extend Seminole Drive across the intersection with Collums Drive/Indian Trail Drive. All of the property owners on Dixie Drive would be able to keep their street numbers on their houses and mailboxes.

The purpose of naming a street after a person, place or idea is to honor that person, place or idea. That is precisely why we would like to change away from the Dixie name. We would be glad to honor the Seminole Indian Tribe with this name.

We have considered other names such as John Lewis Drive or Frederick Douglass Drive but Chapel Hill already has streets named Lewis and Douglas.

The name of Dixie Lane could be Seminole Lane, but it might be wiser to give it a different name to avoid the confusion with Seminole Drive that presently exists for Dixie Lane with Dixie Drive.

We submitted this Petition to the Town of Chapel Hill on October 14, 2020. The staff has reviewed us and advised that we submit it directly to the Town Council.
