Community Development Block Grant Program

U.S. Congress creates CDBG Program in 1974

To develop viable urban communities primarily for low and moderate income people by providing:



- Decent housing
- Suitable living environment
- Economic opportunities

Department of Housing and Urban Development

Administers federal CDBG funds providing annual awards to:



- Cities
- States
- Counties



Chapel Hill has received CDBG awards since 1975


