# **ITEM OVERVIEW**

During the pandemic, the <u>Advisory Board Remote Participation Policy</u><sup>1</sup> has allowed meetings of the Boards and Commissions to be fully virtual, with no members attending in-person. Some key features supporting this approach include:

- No limit on how many meetings an individual can attend remotely
- Remote attendees are able to count towards meeting quorum
- Remote attendees are able to vote on recommendations to Council, formal administrative reviews, and similar actions

Council instituted the features listed above in  $\frac{\text{spring } 2020^2}{\text{spring } 2020^2}$  and resolved to reconsider them once the Governor's State of Emergency ended.

Staff is recommending that Council make these features a permanent part of the Standing Advisory Board Membership Policy. Advisory Boards would then have the option to meet virtually, in-person, or in a hybrid format once the State of Emergency ends.
