





Urban Design Comments

- Massing strategy is well-calibrated in relating to scale of existing buildings
- Public components along and adjacent to Franklin Street.
- Ground floor facades should be transparent
- Enhance vibrancy of porch-like spaces
- Continue pedestrian corridor, in the future, to the south towards Cameron Avenue



Community Design Commission Comments


- Consider more vertical articulation
- Adjust building massing to invite movement through site
- Consider design elements that invite public into campus
- Bring proposed porch experience to Franklin Street
- Narrowness of alley creating tunnel-like feeling
- Architecture of new should respect existing character



Long Range Evaluation

- Site is adjacent to but not in Downtown Focus Area
- Consideration given to:

 - Public art opportunities
 - Wide pedestrian zones





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
