Hi all,

I spoke briefly with Councilman Searing today and we discussed the wayfinding you have on your agenda this evening. I work at Trek Bikes here in Chapel Hill and had a few things to pass along:

- We spend an inordinate amount of time showing customers how to get somewhere by bike. While we
 are of course eager and happy to do so, I strongly support additional signage along our existing
 greenways, bike lanes, and bike routes to show riders how to use bike infrastructure to best get to
 where they are trying to go.
- Having similar information (a map of trails, bike lanes, etc.) would be a great addition on the buses to encourage further bike/bus combination trips.
- We want to help promote bikes as "last mile" transportation. Having a practice bike rack from one of the buses (like in downtown across from Time Out) would be a great addition outside Chapel Hill's bike shops. We likely need to double check with our shopping center ownership, but we would be eager to have a way to show customers who have just purchased a new bike or have just gotten their bike repaired how to use it as transportation, not just recreation. A map or a QR code to an app that can show routes that combine bike and public transport would be a great addition
