Petition to Acquire Eastowne Natural Heritage Site and Designate Natural Conservation Area

To: Chapel Hill Town Council From: Environmental Stewardship Advisory Board October 11, 2022

1. WHEREAS the 20 acre "northern parcel" of the adjacent UNC Health Care property was designated a Natural Heritage site by the State of North Carolina (part of the much larger Dry Creek/Mount Moriah site) and the NC Natural Heritage Program has documented the unique and unusual aspects of this forest, an essential task for a grant application;

2. WHEREAS maintaining forest and tree canopy directly improves local and regional air quality through temperature reduction, removing volatile organic compounds from the air; sequestering carbon that slows climate change, serving as a noise buffer and preventing heat island effects;

3. WHEREAS conserving this natural area supports the Town of Chapel Hill's Climate Action Plan;

4. WHEREAS the preservation of this Natural Heritage site will maintain a contiguous wildlife corridor for our native animal species, connected to land already purchased for habitat, water quality and recreation by the Town of Chapel Hill on one side and by Durham on the other, thus connecting conserved lands in the New Hope and Eno River river basins, as envisioned by the authors of the <u>New Hope</u> <u>Open Space Master Plan</u> and <u>the Landscape Plan for Wildlife Habitat</u>.

5. WHEREAS any construction in the Eastowne Hickory-Oak forest will harm the collective benefit of a contiguous forest by leveling steep slopes, removing tree canopy and the natural filtration of groundwater causing the deterioration of local streams upon which wildlife depend;

5. Whereas we have verified that the North Carolina Land and Water Fund has an Acquisition Grant that is a good match for the creation of this Conservation Area;

6. Whereas UNC Health Care is the current owner of this area and provides excellent health services to our community and supports sustainable practices over the lands it owns, thus contributing to the Environmental Health of our Community and State;

Therefore be it resolved The Environmental Stewardship Advisory Board recommends the Town Council endorse and adopt this resolution to:

- 1. Partner with UNC Health Care to apply for the North Carolina Land and Water Fund Acquisition Grant
- 2. Establish the Eastowne Hickory-Oak Forest as a Conservation Area
