INTEROPERABILITY RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND & MEETINGS

- Commission and Council jointly approved creation of task force in October 2021
- Eight meetings from Jan 2022 Feb 2023, facilitated by Maggie Chotas
- Agreed to work on issues of funding and interoperability separately
- Agreed to process of examining data, asking questions, gathering answers, seeking consensus

FUNDING RATIONALE

- 1. Because the Town of Chapel Hill provides library services for the approximately 61,000 County residents who live in Chapel Hill
- 2. So that County residents who do not live in Chapel Hill can have a CHPL account without paying an out-of-jurisdiction fee

FUNDING FORMULA INTERESTS

THOUGHTFUL - Consider all aspects, not just circulation or cardholders.

EQUITABLE - Equal funding to all residents, regardless of where they live within the County

SUSTAINABLE - Formula should be "future-proof" and adjust if populations/services change.

"ACCESS"
MODEL
(aka Service
Provider
Model)

- A known percentage of County residents live within the Town
- The Town is the primary provider of library services for those County residents
- [Total County funding for Orange County Library operating expenses] x [Percent of Orange County residents living with Town jurisdiction] = Annual County Funding to Town of Chapel Hill

TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATION

- MOU using the "Access/Service Provider" model as the funding formula
- Incorporate a phased approach that will incrementally increase funding
- Be in effect for at least six years (FY 2024 2029)

INTER OPERABILITY INTERESTS

• YIELD SAVINGS for both OCPL and CHPL

• BENEFIT USERS at both OCPL and CHPL

• SHARED BURDEN to both OCPL and CHPL

INTER OPERABILITY INTERESTS

- Shared ILS would not yield cost savings
- No identified benefit to library users for either system
- No other NC county/municipal libraries are interoperable

TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATION

- Continue communication & collaboration
- Consider opportunities for complimentary services
- Consider joint promotional campaign for library services
- Consider periodic report to Commissioners and Council
