
About Holy Trinity Anglican

 - Recently applied for and awarded a NC Civil Rights Trail Marker installed on our property to honor the protesters at the Watts Grill sit-ins in 1964.




The OWASA Service Extension as a Moral Imperative

- Need: Expand affordable housing stock




Water & Sewer Proposal for Southern Chapel Hill
