A RESOLUTION TO RECEIVE AND REFER GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES CENTER PROJECT TO THE TOWN MANAGER AND TOWN ATTORNEY FOR INCLUSION IN A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (2018-01-31/R-6)
