Manager's Recommended Budget Highlights FY2018-19



Responsible, Resilient, Lean and Strategic

- Smart investments in maintenance
- Protecting fund balance to promote resiliency
- Strategic cuts that do not impact services
- Supporting our most valuable resources
- Supporting Council's Strategic Priorities





- 1.0 Cents for Transit to maintain service levels and renew fleet
- 0.8 cents for Debt to support replacement and reconstruction of public assets
- 1.2 cents for General Fund to support core services and sustainability

Chapel Hill Transit



- Funding commitments to partnership require tax increase of 1.0 cents
- Fleet replacement costs driving revenue needs
- UNC and Carrboro funding shares increasing significantly (\$1.36m & \$327,000)
- Budget includes North South BRT design funds from Orange County Transit Plan

Debt Fund (Capital Financing)

- Tax increase is needed to fund planned major capital projects including:
 - Municipal Services Center
 - Streets & Sidewalks
 - Wallace Deck
- Tax increase of 0.8 cents in FY19 covers projects for next 5 years

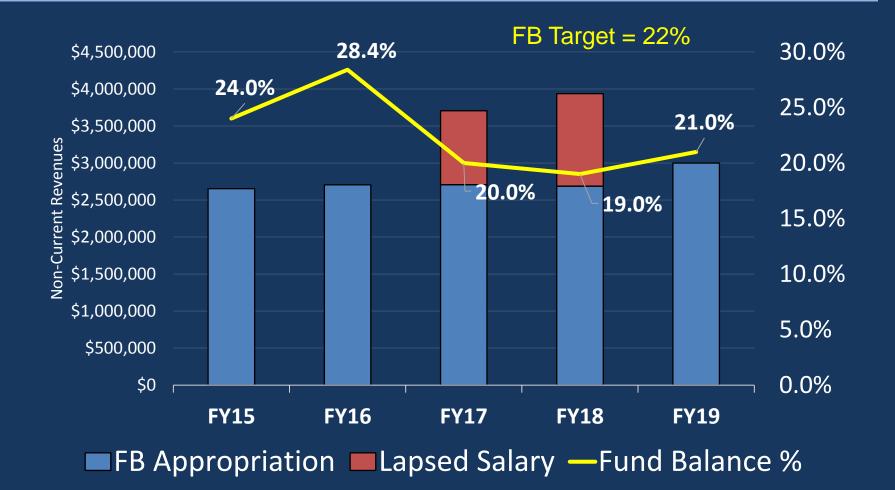

General Fund (Core Services)

- Tax increase is overdue (1.2 cents)
- We cannot use fund balance to fix our revenue problem – fund balance is now below target level (22%)
- Budget maintains existing service levels
- Cost cuts of \$470,000 included in budget
- Strategic priorities are represented throughout the budget

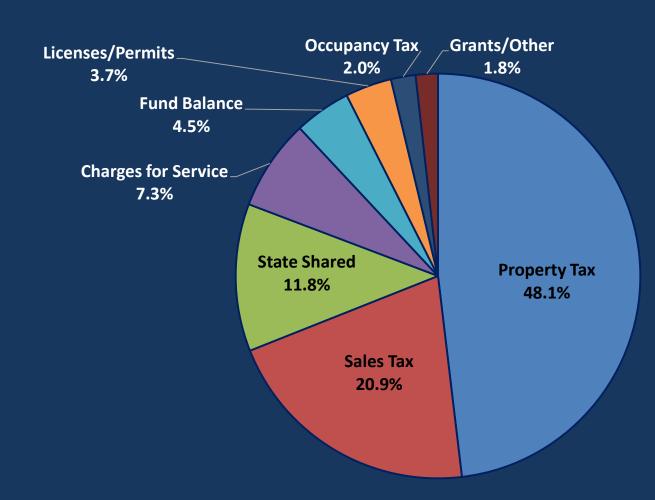

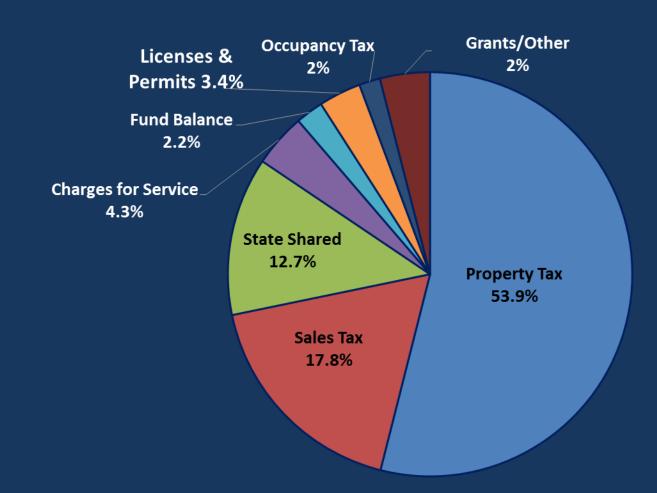
General Fund Revenues FY2018-19





General Fund Revenues FY2011-12





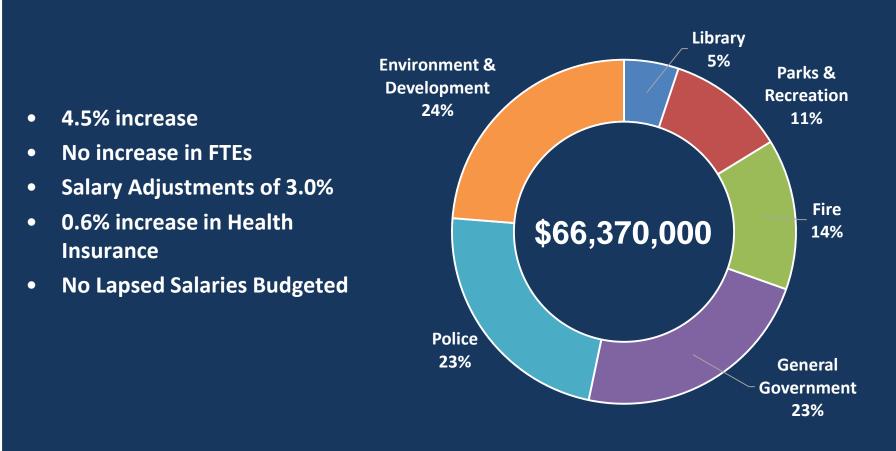

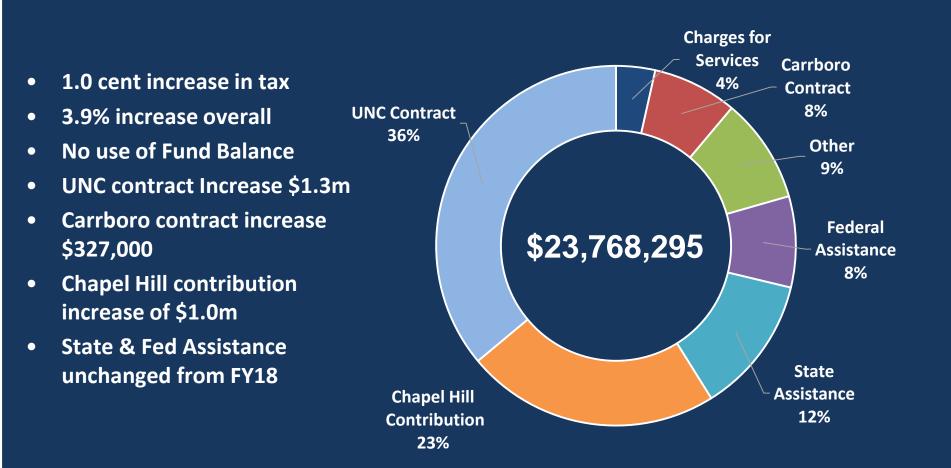
General Fund Expenditures FY2018-19

Sales Tax History



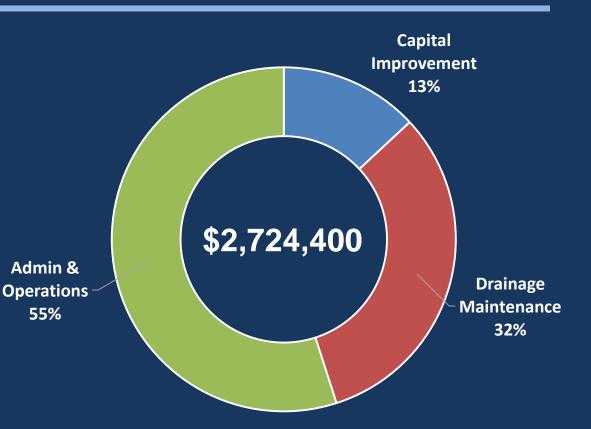


Stormwater Fund Expenditures FY2018-19





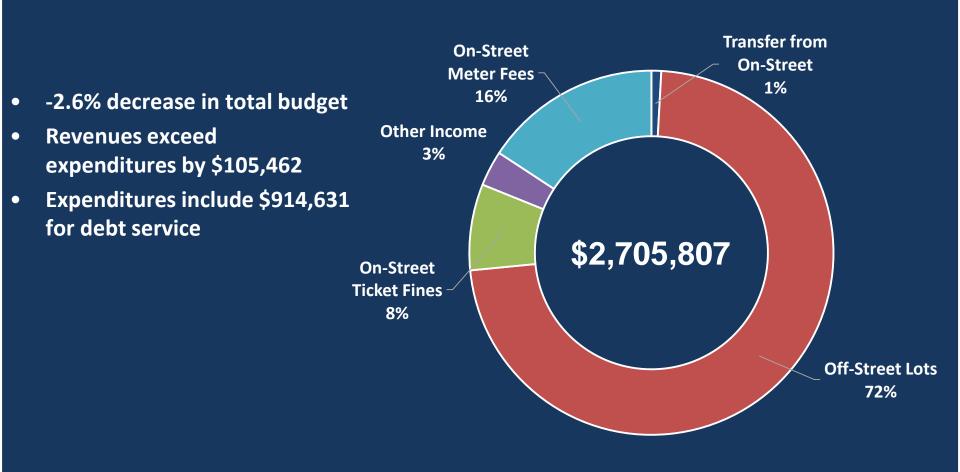

Parking Fund Revenues FY2018-19

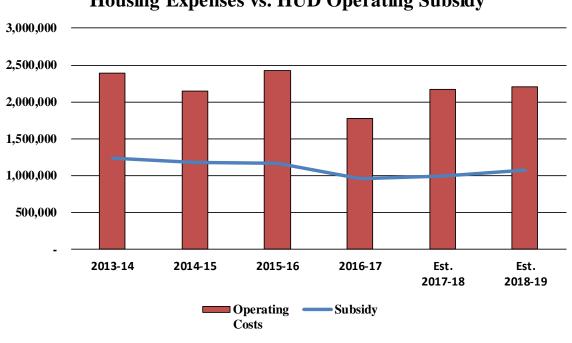




Public Housing Fund Operating Subsidy

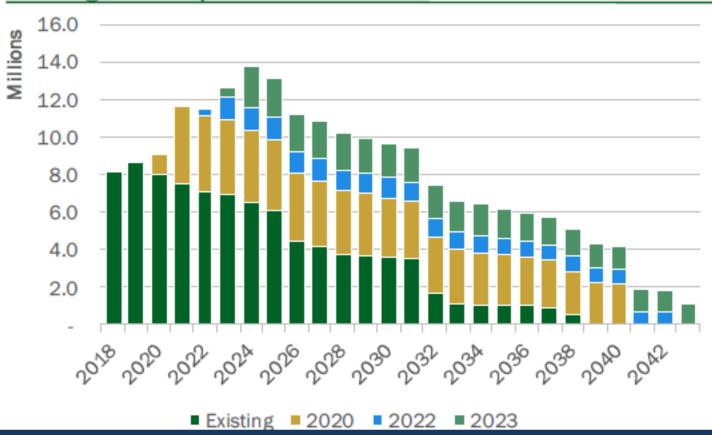
Tax Supported Debt Service
