I have lived and worked in the Historic District for many years, and believe that the preservation of its historic character is one of our most important duties. I have represented clients before the HDC, been a member of and represented the Preservation Society, (now Preservation Chapel Hill), and complained long and loudly about the importance of protecting the trees, open spaces, and historic structures there. I have restored and lived in two homes in the Historic District, and I have served as Trustee/Owner of several office/commercial buildings here, including preservation and sale for restoration of the Old First Methodist Church building at the corner of East Rosemary and Henderson Streets. I have served on the Town's Board of Aldermen (1975-79), as Mayor Pro Tem (1977-79); as an original Board Member of OWASA, then as Counsel to OWASA (1983-2016); as a Member of the N.C. Environmental Management Commission (1992-2002); and as a Trustee of the N.C. Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (2004-2012). I have also served as General Counsel to many public Boards and Agencies, including the Inter-Faith Council for Social Services, the Orange Rape Crisis Center, as a Founding Board Member and Counsel to Orange Coalition for Prevention of Family Violence. I have many years of experience in helping persons navigate and proceed properly with matters under consideration by the elected bodies and their appointed Boards and Commissions in Orange County, and indeed throughout the State. I would be mindful that the HDC is already represented by Town of Chapel Hill Counsel, and I would be careful not to be casual about the importance of his or her advice; I am primarily interested in bringing my experience and interests in conflict mediation to my service with this body. I would like to bring my perspective and experience to add to the mix of ideas and interests that express the mission and drive the work of the Historic District Commission.

I was appointed to serve on the HDC in February 2017, to fill an expiring term. I would like to be re-appointed to be able to serve a full term, and especially to finish my term as Commission Chair, to which I was elected in September, 2017. I have practiced law in Chapel Hill since 1972, where, after graduating from UNC and UNC School of Law, I began teaching as a member of the faculty of the Institute of Government, then transitioned into private practice, and have since operated my law firm with my law partner Joe Hackney in downtown Chapel Hill. I am licensed to practice as an Attorney and Counsellor at Law by the North Carolina Supreme Court, and I am admitted to practice as a member of the United States Supreme Court Bar, as well as before the trial and federal Courts of the Fourth Federal Circuit Court of Appeals, each of the Federal District Courts in North Carolina. In addition, members of the Historic District Commission and Board of Adjustment, when these boards are hearing cases, serve as quasi-judicial bodies. Pursuant to State Statute 106A-388(e)(2), members of these boards "shall not participate in or vote on any quasi-judicial matter in a manner that would violate affected persons' constitutional rights to an impartial decision maker. Impermissible violations of due process include, but are not limited to, a member having a fixed opinion prior to hearing the matter that is not susceptible to change, undisclosed ex parte communications, a close familial, business, or other associational relationship with an affected person, or a financial interest in the outcome of the matter." Any member who violates these Ethics Guidelines may be subject to removal from the board or commission. If the advisory board or commission member believes he/she has a conflict of interest then that member should ask the advisory board or commission to be recused from voting. The advisory board or commission should then vote on the question on whether or not to excuse the member making the request.
