


Human Centered Design

Research Process

- Gathered and analyzed data on youth
- Conducted focus groups
 - 14 focus groups
 180 weight in antioine
 - 180 youth participants
- Mayor's convening of youth-serving organizations



Focus group set-up




Chapel Hill Youth Demographics









2016-'17 College and Career Readiness in Chapel Hill/Carrboro high schools



Mental Health




1 in 4 high school

70% of Chapel Hill & Carrboro high school students get less than 8 hours of sleep



Key Themes

- Safe, inclusive, and welcoming spaces
- Busy schedules and pressures to succeed
- Discrimination impacts youths' lived experiences
- Youth face mental health challenges

What we are doing

- Make existing spaces safe, inclusive, and welcoming for youth
 - Space improvements in town facilities
 - Pilot a youth-friendly business designation

What we are doing

- Continue building intentional partnerships on themes of equity, diversity, and inclusion
 - Hold more focus groups and convenings
 - Include youth in the development and testing of ideas and solutions
 - Strengthen School-Town collaboration







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

- To understand the lives of Chapel Hill youth




What are the sections of the focus groups?
