**Capital Program** 

#### 15 Year Plan for investment in capital projects: Acquiring, building, improving, and maintaining infrastructure, facilities, land & major equipment.



## **Capital Program Components**

- 15 Year Capital Program
  - Pay-go Funded (Annual Budget)
  - Debt & Grant Funded (multi-year project budgets)
  - Financing Plan
  - Debt Fund

## Orange County HOME Consortium initial public hearing held December 3, 2018

- Next Steps:
  - April 2019 Local Government Affordable Housing Collaborative recommendations
  - Annual Action Plan submitted to HUD May 15, 2019

# Amount of Housing Capital Fund Grant for FY20 is unknown at this time

- A preliminary program based on the expected reduced funding level is presented in memo
- A final recommended plan will be presented in April

#### **Public Transportation Grants**

- Estimated funding levels:
  - Federal \$1.9 million
  - State \$2.3 million
  - Other Federal planning funds
- Next Steps:




- Transit Budget will be presented to the Public Transit

#### **Downtown Service District**

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- 7.0 cent tax improvements to Downtown
- Estimated funding for FY20 \$364,000



#### **Potential Legislative Proposals**

- Legislative requests for 2019 legislative session
  - Council met with the Town's Legislative
    Delegation in January
  - The deadline for filing bills is March 28, 2019
  - Proposals can be considered at an upcoming Council meeting
