

### **OCPEH Context**


- Formed in 2008

- Town Office of Housing & Community rep Nate Broman-Fulks







#### OCPEH secured \$8.5 million in federal funding for Orange County since 2005













#### People experiencing homelessness are disproportionately people of color

- Best practice, fully-funded Rapid Re-housing
- Income based rental housing
- Drop-in Day Center with Integrated Services
- Street Outreach
- 24 Hour Bathroom Facilities in Downtown Chapel Hill/Carrboro
- Accessible & Housing Focused Shelter
- Diversion Funding





## **OCPEH Budget Request**

- 21% increase requested for FY 19-20 from FY 18-19
- \$183,352 to \$221,774 total budget
- \$63,899 to \$81,857 Chapel Hill contribution
- Proposed increase would cover Coordinator maternity leave & grantwriter for CoC and ESG grants
