A conflict of interest or a potential conflict occurs if a member has a separate, private, or monetary interest, either direct or indirect, in any issue or transaction under consideration. In addition, members of the Historic District Commission and Board of Adjustment, when these boards are hearing cases, serve as quasi-judicial bodies. Pursuant to State Statute 106A-388(e)(2), members of these boards “shall not participate in or vote on any quasi-judicial matter in a manner that would violate affected persons’ constitutional rights to an impartial decision maker. Impermissible violations of due process include, but are not limited to, a member having a fixed opinion prior to hearing the matter that is not susceptible to change, undisclosed ex parte communications, a close familial, business, or other associational relationship with an affected person, or a financial interest in the outcome of the matter.”

I have had a long-term interest in affordable housing as a socio-economic fairness issue since, as an undergraduate living in the San Francisco Bay Area, I participated in a neighborhood improvement initiative intended, in part, to preserve housing for residents of a lower-income community facing rapid gentrification. At that time, and also as a law student, I provided pro bono services to residents in emergency housing. I view service on the Housing Advisory Board as a further expression of my commitment to working on these issues, and an opportunity to gain new and concrete experience in the affordable housing area while contributing to the Town's efforts to create a more equitable community. As an attorney with a general litigation background and experience with lending and housing issues, I can provide significant assistance to the board in connection with the administration of AHDR funds and formulating policy advice to the town council. For example, I have represented clients in mortgage lending disputes, landlord-tenant disputes and co-op litigation. While living in an Oxford House which provided a clean, safe living environment located in Chapel Hill, I met some residents who had lived there for as many as nine years because the barriers to conventional housing such as low income, criminal background, or poor credit prevented them from moving. To meet the requirements of Oxford House, a resident must work or do volunteer work for 20 hours a week. I found growth at Oxford House by working for six months at Freedom House as a volunteer. There I learned of others' concerns. I met mothers and fathers there desperate to get conventional housing so they could start over again and get their kids back. Oxford House and Freedom House were safe zones with no exits.

I want to share and express the endless pain I have seen of those with whom I have lived, those needing decent affordable housing for themselves and their loved ones. I know I can articulate the experiences, the distress, and the hopes of those I have known.

ETHICS GUIDELINES FOR TOWN ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Members of advisory boards and commissions shall not discuss, advocate, or vote on any matter in which they have a conflict of interest or an interest which reasonably might appear to be in conflict with the concept of fairness in dealing with public business. A conflict of interest or a potential conflict occurs if a member has a separate, private, or monetary interest, either direct or indirect, in any issue or transaction under consideration. In addition, members of the Historic District Commission and Board of Adjustment, when these boards are hearing cases, serve as quasi-judicial bodies. Pursuant to State Statute 106A-388(e)(2), members of these boards “shall not participate in or vote on any quasi-judicial matter in a manner that would violate affected persons’ constitutional rights to an impartial decision maker. Impermissible violations of due process include, but are not limited to, a member having a fixed opinion prior to hearing the matter that is not susceptible to change, undisclosed ex parte communications, a close familial, business, or other associational relationship with an affected person, or a financial interest in the outcome of the matter.”

Any member who violates these Ethics Guidelines may be subject to removal from the board or commission. If the advisory board or commission member believes he/she has a conflict of interest then that member should ask the advisory board or commission to be recused from voting. The advisory board or commission should then vote on the question on whether or not to excuse the member making the request. In cases where the individual member or the advisory board or commission establishes a conflict of interest, then the advisory board or commission member shall remove themselves from the voting area. Any advisory board or commission member may seek the counsel of the Town Attorney on questions regarding the interpretation of these ethics guidelines or other conflict of interest matters. The interpretation may include a recommendation on whether or not the advisory board or commission member should excuse himself/herself from voting. The advisory board or commission member may request the Town Attorney respond in writing.
