As a downtown business manager, a young professional, and someone who deeply loves Chapel Hill, I want to see everyone in our town succeed. I hear the various perspectives our residents and visitors have regarding the racial climate in our town and I want to empower those voices while initiating change. Being involved with the students and locals that opposed and fought against Silent Sam has been an eyeopening experience to me. Hearing their thoughts on our town and how it has handled such tension is discouraging and frustrating. Seeing the attitude towards Chapel Hill on social media has revealed to me that not all that is perception is reality, but there is definitely room for improvement and a need for better communication and partnership. As the Vice Chair of the Downtown Partnership, I recognize that Chapel Hill lacks in diversity of business owners as well as on our advisory boards and committees. Speaking to fellow (and powerful) white business/property owners in our town with clear biases and problematic ideologies is of great concern to me for this community. It is important that we are hearing out the Chapel Hill experience from people of color and continuing to educate our community and community leaders on how we can be the best allies. I often say that Chapel Hill is full of leaders that like to speak progressively, but don't actually serve progressively through change or statute.
