**2.** Street Resurface Evaluation

FY19-23 Proposed Street Resurfacing notes

Megan Dale, Town Staff, presented on the street resurfacing evaluation - a tentative five year plan. The presentation highlighted the pavement condition evaluation, priority consideration given, coordination with internal staff and other agencies, and a list of proposed streets.

Megan pointed out that priority considerations are given to: council and community interest, multi-modal streets and collector streets, and projects that leverage funds and investments.

Vice-Chair Susanne Kjemtrup-Lovelace recommended that the Mobility and Connectivity Plan be considered in the prioritization process.

A motion was made by Hageman, seconded by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, to make the following recommendations: to include potential multi-modal streets identified in the Mobility and Connectivity Plan as criteria in the prioritization and establish an decision-making mechanism for with streets that present conflicting needs. The motion passed unanimously.

3. 1751 Dobbins Drive Site Plan & Site Details

Keith Shaw, Shaw Design Associates Representative, presented on the 1751 Dobbins Drive development. This is a conditional zoning request, proposed to demolish a existing single-family unit and construct a 5,500 square foot office building with two stories and 21 parking spaces.

Keith highlighted modifications of key features: landscape buffer on west property line, minimum interior setback width, steep slopes requirement, and foundation to buffer strip. Keith noted drainage improvements, location of existing two-way driveway, dedicated car pooling space, and 6 bike parking spaces. The development will not disturb the existing sidewalk, and they intend to provide a payment-in-lieu for the multi-modal sidepath.

The development will not include an electric vehicle charging space. The developer submitted a Transportation Management Plan to reduce single occupancy vehicle use to the site.

A motion was made by Hageman, seconded by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, to support the 1751 Dobbins Drive development with the following recommendations: of using the board's electric vehicle readiness standards, and to request fewer parking spaces if feasible in order to incorporate additional green space. The motion passed unanimously.

Justin Brown, Pennoni Representative, presented the Wegmans SUP Modification site plan. Justin noted the original site plan portrayed ingress only from US 15-501 to access the development. The current plan allows full access movement from signalized intersection of Eastowne Drive and US 15-501.

Justin mentioned the Chair Jason Merrill's interest to add a fourth crosswalk on the western leg of Eastowne Drive and US 15-501 signalized intersection.

A motion was made by Hageman, seconded by Allman, to support Wegmans SUP Modification site plan with the following recommendation: of adding a fourth crosswalk on the western leg of Eastowne Drive and US 15-501 signalized intersection. The motion passed unanimously.
