



Next Steps



- Return in January 2020 with suggested revisions to the Focus Area Maps and Principles.
- Remaining Future Land Use Map (FLUM) components:
 - Precedent images of Character Types;
 - New University-Supportive Mixed Use (USMU) land use category;
 - Revised Map Book; and,
 - * Revised Guiding Statements.
- Decisions on these remaining items will be necessary prior to Council consideration of the complete FLUM.
