Dear Mr. Bassett:

Thank you for your March 10 and 17, 2021, emails providing the proposed new plat boundary for the Post Office property. The proposed plat eliminates the Wallace parking deck portion of the land purchased from the USPS, while the Town of Chapel Hill retains the Post Office building/lot and the lot directly behind it. You also stated that the existing covenants will remain on the new plat as they currently exist.

Given this information, we reaffirm our finding that the proposed sale of portion of the Post Office parcel will not adversely affect the Chapel Hill National Register Historic District (OR0078). Please provide a copy of the new Post Office plat. Including both portions as well as a copy of the covenants that go with the lots so that we may update our files for this historic property.
