

Key Issues

- The Town owns the property adjacent to the east of 502 Gomains Avenue and the subject ROW. As there is no use for this ROW, staff recommends giving this portion of the ROW to the owner of 502 Gomains Avenue.
- The adjacent property owner of 502 Edwards Drive(owned by Special Needs Trust for Elizabeth Young) has requested half of the subject ROW to be conveyed to that person. This is per NCGS Sec. 160A-299.
- The Town-owned property northeast of 502 Gomains Avenue and adjacent to the subject ROW will be re-combined with the Townowned property adjacent to 502 Gomains Avenue.
