## **Approval of Minutes**

1. June 15, 2021 Meeting Minutes

A motion was made by Bench, seconded by Mitchell, to approve the June 15, 2021 meeting minutes. The motion passed by a unanimous vote.

#### **New Business**

2. Land Use Management Ordinance Text Amendment - Section 3.11.3.5 Blue Hill Form District

[21-0675]

A motion was made by Bench, seconded by Losos, to recommend that lodging uses in the Blue Hill District (both hotels/overnight lodging and short-term rentals) should not count as the nonresidential component of a Mixed-Use Building or Site. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

The Commission held an informal vote on the question of operational standards for Short-Term Rentals. A majority of Commission members held the view that the standards for Short-Term Rentals town-wide (Article 6.27) should not apply in the Blue Hill District. No further motions were made.

3. LUMO Text Amendment - Membership Rules of the Community Design Commission

A motion was made by Rees, seconded by Losos, to recommend that the Council adopt Resolution A (Resolution of Consistency). The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Rees, seconded by Losos, to recommend that the Council enact Ordinance A approving the proposed text amendments. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

4. Consider an application for a Major Modification to the Glen Lennox Development Agreement - Height Modification

[21-0677]

A motion was made by Bench, seconded by Rees, to recommend Council approval of Resolution A (Resolution of Consistency) with the stipulation that the Council and the developer continue to look at opportunities for additional green space as a community amenity and for reducing the number of parking spaces. The motion carried by a vote of 7 to 1.

Commissioner Mitchell explained his reason for recommending denial. He stated his interest in knowing why the current building heights were set as

part of the original Development Agreement before approving a motion to modify the height limits.

A motion was made by Bench, seconded by Baxter, to recommend that the Council adopt Ordinance A, approving the proposed text amendments. The motion carried by a vote of 5 to 3.

Commissioners Mitchell, Rivers, and Whitlow explained their recommendations for denial. There was an interest in pursuing alternative way to address issue by including longer start and completion timelines within the approving documents; interest in respecting the proposed three years; and exploring a process that meets the needs of public projects.
