Dear Mayor Hemminger and Town Clerk Harvey:

I am writing to you as a former member of the Town of Chapel Hill Cemetery Board and as someone who plans to be interred in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery.

I was upset to hear that a large columbarium is planned on the edge (but still inside) the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery grounds. I realize that burial space in Chapel Hill is at a premium since the town has run out of space and has not provided any more, but I think we need to give a little more thought about putting such a large monument inside the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery.

Some concerns.....

- 1. Why are Canadians doing all the stone work? Is there no one in the United States, or at least the southeast or maybe even North Carolina who can put this together? Were American companies even considered?
- 2. When I was a member, the Cemetery Board worked long and hard at finding a place for a columbarium at the Legion Road Cemetery. Much thought was given to encroachment on adjoining plots, compatible design, appropriateness of design, lighting/vandalism issues, etc. How much thought has gone into the ramifications of this structure? It seems that this is just one person's use of his parent's plots. Have you made any effort to notify families in neighboring plots?
- 3. I am a little curious about the financing of this project. I know from our work at Legion Road that such structures are costly and come with inevitable upkeep. Is there a non-profit that will be taking on these expenses? For that matter, is this a non-profit or for profit venture? Beyond the city fees, how much can this gentleman charge for such plots in the columbarium? You may be providing a few extra burial places, but in the long run they will run out, too. Can this gentleman charge whatever he thinks the market will bear? If only a very few wealthy people can afford them......

- 4. If this person can use his parents' plots in this way, what is to stop anyone else who owns a plot in the cemetery from doing the same thing? If they are near a walkway or a wall, it would meet the same criteria. And you might not even have to build a bridge or pull down a tree. If you allowed such a structure in some parts of the cemetery and not in others, you might end up with a discrimination lawsuit......
- 4. Very few cemeteries in the U.S. are in the Register of Historic Places could you jeopardize this landmark status by irrevocably changing the design of the cemetery?

I appreciate your dilemma in providing burial places when the town as run out, but hope that you will look long and hard at this project before saying yes. Start looking for some land.......

As an owner of plots and eventual resident of Old Chapel Hill Cemetery, I must strongly oppose the reimagined petition for commercial development of columbaria in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery. The mere thought of taking this beloved ground and turning it into a for-profit enterprise is distasteful and hopefully will be denied outright! This is a public cemetery, not a business development zone.

Aesthetically, the placement of this massive entity is objectively repulsive to me and other plots owners I have addressed. Since this is a subjective opinion, it should be nevertheless be considered.

The petitioner asserts that these commercial columbaria are needed in Chapel Hill. This simply is not true. There are ample columbaria currently available and ample future columbaria possible at Memorial Cemetery. The need has been addressed and exists.

Is there a desire for columbaria at the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery - yes and that desire may be immense - without necessary merit or need. Multiple columbaria across the still 20% unused plots could no doubt still be developed and sold, but is this really desirable? The main desire is from the petitioner and this desire is to make great personal wealth from this commercial enterprise! If this petition is approved, then every other plot owner must have equal opportunity for development and sale.

Many issues are raised the petition. Who can attest to the foreign manufactured module, what warranty does it have and who will correct problems upon installation. The entire placement of the module warrants critical professional analysis and study. Merely hiring an outside entity to be involved in construction needs attention. Even the removal of yet another mature tree to make this happens needs arborist input even before consideration.

The opening and endorsement of commercial development in the Cemetery raises huge liability issues not present for any other plots in the Cemetery. First, how can the town undertake security for these multiple ownership entities which is unique among the Cemetery residents. Second, how does the town undertake the costs and inherent risks in assuring the public integrity and stability of the structure? The multiple ownership entity has immense potential costs and risks to the town. Third, who will assure the security to each individual owner of units when the town has no overall security system unique to this module - especially costs and liability exposure to the town? In the event of failure to individual units, multiple units, or the entire structure-who will have to pay for this repair or replacement in full costs? The overall liability costs and cost potential to the town in the long term may be staggering, and unlike any other entity in the Cemetery! Who will pay upkeep for the exterior structure over the long term, as emergencies arise? Since this module will involve multiple owners in a single module, how does the town get involved in foreclosures or legal actions against individual owners? The whole liability to the town may be staggering.

As the business plans to involve the university/state in access and legal cooperation, the issue of the Umstead Act and its impact on this linkage must be addressed, from the standpoint of current plot owners and the state entering this economic arrangement.

Finally, the unique status of the Cemetery inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places may be impacted and by the time this impact is realized, it is too late to undo this. Care to protect this very special status must be addressed.

Even though I respect the right for free enterprise and profit making businesses, I respectfully ask that this not be allowed in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery, for the respect of all this buried there now and in the future.

I am writing in opposition to the pending proposal for construction and operation of a columbarium in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery ("the Cemetery"). I endorse the views expressed by Stephen Moore and wish to contribute my own thoughts, which I expect reflect the feelings of many UNC alumni.

First, I will state my interest in this matter. I graduated from Carolina in 1969 and lived in Chapel Hill while attending Duke Law School, where I met my wife. Although my wife and I have lived, practiced law, and raised our children in the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area for many years, like so many other UNC alumni I have an enduring love for the University and the Town. Indeed, our daughter, son-in-law and grandson now live in Chapel Hill and we are in the process of relocating there. In addition, my wife and I are to be buried in the Cemetery.

With regard to the proposal to establish a commercial columbarium in the Cemetery, I would like to offer a few perspectives on the potential impact of the project.

First, I would offer the perspective of a student who found the Cemetery a unique part of my University education and experience. Immediately adjacent to the paths that are filled daily with rushing and aspiring young people, the Cemetery contributes (and has always contributed) to the spiritual and philosophical perspectives of countless students. It serves as a quiet, beautiful and accessible place for the young to contemplate the lives of the remarkable people who have preceded them. This precious and enriching aspect of student life in Chapel Hill should be preserved and protected from detrimental change.

Second, I would offer my perspective on the potential detrimental effect of a columbarium to this precious environment. I am the owner of burial plots adjacent to the graves of my parents in a lovely cemetery in High Point. Those plots are within fifty feet of a large columbarium. On days when many relatives and friends visit the columbarium, the otherwise pastoral and tranquil atmosphere of the greater part of the cemetery can be disturbed by the numbers of visitors to the columbarium site. In the same way, the proposed columbarium for the Cemetery could do irreversible harm to the invaluable spiritual and contemplative haven that the Cemetery has been for so many for so long.

Thank you for the opportunity to offer these views for your consideration.



- 3. The Administration of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill shall be presented with, and shall concur in, the master plan of improvements and restoration prepared by the Town of Chapel Hill prior to commencement of any work in the cemetery.
- 4. The Town of Chapel Hill shall now and forever more be sensitive to preservation issues in its restoration, improvement, and maintenance of the cemetery.
- 5. Should the Town of Chapel Hill fail to perform any of the above-mentioned conditions, the subject land herein shall revert to the State of North Carolina.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and all privileges thereunto belonging, unto the party of the second part, and its successors and assigns, free and discharged

CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

- · OCHC established 1798.
- · 1922 UNC & TCH agree that TCH shall maintain OCHC and administer sale of plots.
- 1989 State of North Carolina grants quit claim deed of OCHC to TCH for purpose of landscape improvements, stone wall repairs, grave marker repairs, walkway improvements and signage. The land is conveyed subject to certain conditions which are expressly assented to by the second party (TCH) in accepting their deed, said conditions being as follows:
- 1) TCH will maintain the OCHC in suitable condition in perpetuity.
- 2) TCH will grant some indicia of ownership (cemetery deed or other) of grave plots assigned to or belonging to individuals, families, and certain organizations. . . .
- 3) UNC shall be presented with, and shall concur in, the master plan of improvements and restoration prepared by the TCH prior to commencement of any work in the cemetery.
- 4) The TCH shall now and forever more be sensitive to preservation issues in its restoration, improvement, and maintenance of the cemetery.
- 5) Should the TCH fail to perform any of these conditions, the land shall revert to the State of North Carolina.
- The quitclaim deed provides modern precedence supporting original precedence of fee simple ownership of all grave plots within OCHC.
- · OCHC is regulated by TCH, a governmental agency, and is exempt from NC Cemetery Act. Ref: Section 65-47. A. Scope.
- OCHC is not mentioned or named in the TCH Code of Ordinances.
- · OCHC may be included in TCH within Chapter 6, Article I. In General. This section refers to below ground graves, grave liners and vaults, peace and good order, traffic, animals, hours of operation, disturbing/defacing of graves, and artificial flowers.
- · Above ground interments are dealt with only in Article II. regarding Chapel Hill Memorial Cemetery (CHMC). Further, the code states "No conveyance of title of grave space. Fee simple title for property in CHMC shall remain vested in the TCH.
- This statement clearly is intended to delineate free flowing Fee Simple rights of private ownership in OCHC from restricted ownership rights in favor of the TCH in the CHMC.
- · Article III pertains to West Chapel Hill Cemetery and concludes the extent of Chapter 6. Cemeteries of the Town Code of Ordinances.
- Research reveals the presence of two above ground level columbaria and one mausoleum in the OCHC.
