Consider Approving a Process for Town Council Members to Submit Petition, Resolution, and Proclamation Requests

NOVEMBER 17, 2021

Recommendation

- That the Council:
 - Discuss the draft process, including areas still needing agreement
 - Consider adopting the resolution to approve the process with any revisions agreed upon during the meeting

Goals of Establishing a Process

- Create consistency in how requests come forward
- Allow collaboration and input from additional
 Council Members as requests are being developed
- Provide predictability for how the requests are responded to

Process as Currently Drafted

- Council Petition: to formally request that the Council consider taking an action such as adopting a policy, amending an ordinance, or changing a practice
- Resolution or Proclamation: for the Council to consider adopting a formal statement about an issue of importance

Council Petition	Resolution/Proclamation
May require a future Council action to change a policy, amend an ordinance	Statement of support about a cause, issue, or person
Council decision will be guided by staff research and recommendations	Little or no staff resources/analysis required to bring forward
Council action may require staff resources and/or funding to implement	Council action requires little or no staff resources or budget to implement

Additional Notes

 A majority of Council Members collaborating on a request could constitute a public meeting, even if done electronically

 This process meant to complement Council's function as a policy-making board

- Should the sitting Council establish a process for future Councils to follow?
 - Interest: Create an objective, flexible process that can work for different Councils.

- What minimum number of Council members are required to bring a petition forward?
 - Interest: Provide a platform for Council members to raise an idea in a way that respects the board's need for efficiency and uses staff resources effectively.

- What role(s) should the Mayor and Manager/staff play in the process?
 - Interest: Establish an impartial process where all board members feel assured their request will be responded to timely.

- Is the distinction between petitions, resolutions, and proclamations clear enough?
 - Interest: Avoid confusion among Council Members about which part of the process to follow when bringing forward a request.

- Should the sitting Council establish a process for future Councils to follow?
