3. Recommendation to Council: Blue Hill Design Guidelines

[18-0297]

Corey Liles (Town staff) presented the Blue Hill Design Guidelines to the Planning Commission.

Commissioner Bench moved and Commissioner McCullough seconded to recommend adoption of the Design Guideline Updates with the proposed changes:

Building Street Types:

- -Type D: be changed to agree with CDC recommendation of further study
- -Type E: include all of the CDC recommendations

Building Massing:

-70% upper plate reduction is recommended but would require a stepback to the "front" or most visited façade

Design Alternatives:

- -Encourage utilization of rooftop space removing rooftop as a qualifying amenity space
- -Recommend 8% open amenity space ratio rather than 6%
- -Recommend that planning evaluate the downsides of removing forecourt space

Enhanced standards:

-Drive thrus be prohibited and the Commission believes it to be counter to the intention of the Blue Hill District and Chapel Hill 2020

Review and Applications:

-The PC Endorse the CDCs recommendation that Council and not Town Manager approve revisions to the Design Guidelines
