Jomar Pastorelle, Town Staff, presented on the E. Rosemary Street Parking Deck - Conditional Zoning. Pastorelle recapped on the project overview including site plan details, process, and design/LUMO standards.

Joe Dye, Executive Vice President of Grubb Properties, provided a brief overview of the E. Rosemary Street Parking Deck redevelopment project. Michael Stevenson, Perkins & Will architect, shared updated information on parking summary, parking deck access, Rosemary Street public realm, traffic patterns, parking deck design, and site plan.

Craig Scheffler, HNTB consultant, presented the Traffic Impact Analysis for the E. Rosemary Parking Deck. Scheffler provided information on the transportation impact analysis process, analysis methodology, existing conditions analysis, 2020 site plan analysis, trip generation / assignment, capacity analysis results, and recommended improvements. Chair Merrill opened the floor for public comments. No public comments were offered.

A motion was made by Juliano, seconded by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, to approve the conditional zoning for E. Rosemary Street parking deck with the following recommendations: prioritize pedestrian safety, increase the amount of 'electric vehicle' ready parking spaces, conduct a comprehensive traffic impact analysis study to include the entire E. Rosemary Street project, incorporate the NS BRT project into the traffic impact analysis, and provide ridesharing spaces. The motion failed, 5-3.

A second motion was made Hageman, seconded by Whaley, to recommend that Town Council deny the project unless it takes into consideration the recommendations made in the first motion. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Staff Report

Bergen Watterson, Town Staff, shared with the advisory board that May was Bike Month. Watterson encouraged the board to visit Go Chapel Hill website. Watterson shared that the Elliott Road Extension project is moving forward and will be on the June 10th Town Council agenda.

Watterson informed the board that staff were aware of a petition for closing streets on W. Franklin to support active transportation while maintaining social distance, including expand sidewalk dining and retail sales during Covid-19.

A motion was made by Brutz, seconded by Hageman, to support the "Feet on Franklin: Let's Seize the Moment in Chapel Hill" petition and support Town response to the petition. The motion passed unanimously.

Jomar Pastorelle, Town Staff, informed the advisory board has been asked to reschedule the June 23rd meeting. The board agreed to schedule the next meeting for June 30th.
