A motion was made by Member Wallace, seconded by Member Ames, that the conditional zoning application for the Weavers Grove project located at 7615 Sunrise Road be recommended for approval with the condition and special considerations listed below. The motion carried by a vote of 7-1. Member Henkel voted against stating that he wanted "solar-ready building design" to

be a condition rather than a special consideration.

- b. Development Application Review for 108 West
