Traffic Impact Analysis (Executive Summary)

Jomar Pastorelle, Town Staff, presented on S. Columbia Street Annex - conditional zoning application. Pastorelle provided an overview of the subject property including site details, traffic impact analysis, and process.

Wendi Ramsden, Coulter Jewell Thames, PA, highlighted the proposed site plans, alternative modes of transportation, implementations of Town plans and policies, traffic impact analysis, parking layout, pubic safety, and future oriented design.

A motion was made by Brutz, seconded by Chair Merrill, to recommend approval of the conditional zoning permit for S. Columbia Street Annex with

the following conditions:

- -50% reduction of total parking spaces.
- -Dedicate transportation network company (TNC) parking spaces.
- -No Right on Red movements when the pedestrian signals are activated.
- -Install a crosswalk north of the S. Columbia Street and NC 54 Bypass intersection.
- -Install a crosswalk south of the S. Columbia Street and Purefoy Road intersection.
- -Coordinate with Town staff on the NS BRT station location to ensure safe and convenient access for pedestrians.
- -Provide improved lighting at the crosswalks.
- -Provide an current traffic impact analysis study.

The motion failed, 5-2.

A second motion was made by Hageman, seconded by Allman, to recommend denial for future developments on the subject property site unless Town Council take into consideration the following conditions:

- -50% reduction of total parking spaces.
- -Dedicate transportation network company (TNC) parking spaces.
- -No Right on Red movements when the pedestrian signals are activated.
- -Install a crosswalk north of the S. Columbia Street and NC 54 Bypass intersection.
- -Install a crosswalk south of S. Columbia Street and Purefoy Road intersection.
- -Coordinate with Town staff on the NS BRT station location to ensure safe and convenient access for pedestrians.
- -Provide improved lighting at the crosswalks.
- -Provide a current traffic impact analysis study.

The motion passed unanimously.

Mobility Plan Update - Chart (09.22.20)

Bergen Watterson, Town Staff, presented on the Mobility and Connectivity Plan Update. Watterson provided background content including North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Complete Streets policy, complete streets, examples of proposed enhancements, NC 54 Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety plan, and next steps.

Eli Powell, Town Staff, walked through the story map website including the original 2017 Long Term Facilities Network map, bicycle facility definitions, and the updated Long Term Facilities Network map. Watterson announced that staff will be hosting a virtual public meeting on September 29, 2020, and virtual office hours on September 30, 2020 and on October 1, 2020.

A motion was made by Hageman, seconded by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, to support the initial Mobility and Connectivity Plan (2017) and the updated Mobility and Connectivity Plan (2020). The motion passed unanimously.

Jomar Pastorelle, Town Staff, introduced two of the four eligible applicants. Katie Huge and Denise Matthews introduced themselves and stated their interest in serving on the advisory board.

A motion was made by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, seconded by Juliano, to recommend that Town Council appoint Denise Matthews to the Regional Collaborator seat and appoint Katie Huge to the Chapel Hill Resident seat. The motion passed unanimously.

Pastorelle announced that the advisory board will need to hold an election to nominate a new Chair.

A motion was made by Vice-Chair Kjemtrup-Lovelace, seconded by Hageman, to recommend that Heather Brutz serve as the new Chair. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 5-Year Resurface Plan (FY 21-25) - TCAB Attachments:

Michael Wright, Town Staff, presented on the 5-Year Resurface Plan (FY21-FY25). Wright discussed the review and approval process, the pavement condition evaluation, pavement distresses, proposed fiscal year street resurfacing lists, and alternative street resurfacing list.

Bergen Watterson, Town Staff, added connections to the Mobility Plan, coordination with the resurfacing timeline, rendering of the proposed bicycle climbing lane on Country Club Road, she explained that Town plans to use the Town-wide traffic model to evaluate multimodal changes to roads with competing or complex needs.

A motion was made by Juliano, seconded by Brutz, to recommend that Town Council dedicate funds to improve the overall conditions of town maintained streets and sidewalks. The motion passed unanimously.
