Overview: The purpose of this item is to update the Council on County-wide plans for creating a Crisis Diversion Facility in Orange County.

Recommendation(s):

That the Council receive the report.

Key Issues:

- A County-wide subcommittee, including a representative from the Town's Crisis Unit, was charged with developing recommendations for Orange County crisis services that would facilitate diversion of individuals experiencing crisis from a hospital based emergency department or the criminal justice system.
- Orange County staff has presented this update to the Town of Carrboro and the Orange County Board of Commissioners.
- Development of a Crisis Diversion facility would support the prevention, crisis, and post crisis
