Overview: During the pandemic, the <a href="Standing Advisory Board Remote Participation Policy">Standing Advisory Board Remote Participation Policy</a> <a href="https://www.townofchapelhill.org/government/mayor-and-council/boards-commissions/board-membership-policy">https://www.townofchapelhill.org/government/mayor-and-council/boards-commissions/board-membership-policy</a> has allowed meetings of the Boards and Commissions to be fully virtual, with no members attending in-person. Town Council instituted this approach in <a href="mainto:spring 2020">spring 2020</a> <a href="https://chapelhill.legistar.com/LegislationDetail.aspx?ID=4538871&GUID=64B8CA34-E001-4F39-AAB6-21A8CB617DC8">https://chapelhill.legistar.com/LegislationDetail.aspx?ID=4538871&GUID=64B8CA34-E001-4F39-AAB6-21A8CB617DC8</a> and resolved to reconsider the approach once the Governor's State of Emergency ended. Tonight's item would make remote participation and voting an ongoing option for non-quasi-judicial matters before Advisory Boards.

#### **Proposed Remote Participation Parameters**

| Feature of Current Policy                   | Proposed                          |

| No limit on how many meetings an individual | Continue, state clearly in policy |
| member can attend remotely                  |                                   |

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|   | Continue, allow at all times (not just during States of Emergency)              |

| Remote attendees may vote on recommendations to Council, formal administrative reviews, and similar actions | ,   |
| Historic District Commission may vote on quasi-   | Allow only during a Governor's State of Emergency, in accordance with State law |

Note: The Governor's State of Emergency is currently still in place. There have been discussions around ending it, but no timeline indicated.
